IMPORTANT QUESTIONS TO ASK

If you are going to try and alternative approach, here are some questions that are worth asking before you go ahead:

Is the therapy or therapist reputable?

This sort of information isn't always easy to obtain. Sometimes the best way to choose a therapist is on personal recommendation from someone else who has ME/CFS, or possibly your GP. An increasing number of specialties in the alternative sector now have their own regulatory hodies - rather like the General Medical Council for doctors - but they it important to check that the
